



MORE JOB VACANCIES IN THE SECOND QUARTER 2015

- In the second quarter of 2015, **the job vacancies rate** was 1.06%, increasing by 0.03 percentage points as against the previous quarter.
- The **number of job vacancies** was 47.4 thousand, increasing by 2.3 thousand as against the previous quarter.
- By comparison with the same quarter of 2014, the job vacancies rate increased by 0.22 percentage points and the number of job vacancies increased by 11.1 thousand.

The rate and number of job vacancies by activity of national economy

In the second quarter of 2015, the **highest** <u>job</u> <u>vacancies rates</u> were registered in <u>public</u> <u>administration</u> (3.17%) and <u>in other service</u> <u>activities</u> (2.50%).

In *manufacturing* was concentrated allmost 30% from the <u>total number of job vacancies</u> (14.1 thousand job vacancies), having a value *rate* of 1.27%.

The budgetary sector summed up over one third of the <u>total number of job vacancies</u>. Thus, 8.0 thousand job vacancies were registered in <u>public administration</u>, 6.0 thousand job vacancies in <u>human health and social work activities</u>, respectively 2.2 thousand job vacancies in <u>education</u>.

At the opposite side, the **lowest** values for both <u>the rate</u> and <u>the number of job vacancies</u> were found in <u>mining</u> and <u>quarrying</u> (0.10%, respectively 0.1 thousand job vacancies),


followed by *electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply* (0.15%, respectively 0.1 thousand job vacancies).

Quarter II 2015 compared to previous periods

As against the **previous quarter**, the most significant **increases** of <u>the job vacancies rate</u> were registered in water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (+0.22 percentage points), respectively in manufacturing (+0.17 percentage points).

As concerning <u>the number of job vacancies</u>, the most important **increases** were found in *manufacturing* (+2.1 thousand job vacancies), respectively in *wholesale* (+0.5 thousand job vacancies).

Decreases of <u>the job vacancies rate</u> were noticed in *professional, scientific and technical activities* (-0.29 percentage points), followed by *mining and quarrying* (-0.16 percentage points) and as regarding <u>the number of job vacancies</u> in *construction*, respectively in *transportation and storage* (-0.4 thousand job vacancies each).

As against the same quarter of the previous year, the job vacancies rates registered relevant increases in arts, entertainment and recreation (+0.93 percentage points), respectively in public administration (+0.74 percentage points) and the most significant decrease was for accommodation and food service activities (-0.09 percentage points).

<u>The number of job vacancies</u> increased in manufacturing (+3.6 thousand job vacancies), respectively in *public administration*


(+2.1 thousand job vacancies) and in *education* (-0.3 thousand job vacancies) was noticed the most relevant **decrease**.

The rate and number of job vacancies by major groups of occupations

In the second quarter of 2015, the **highest** demand for paid labour force expressed by employers for both <u>the rate</u> and <u>the number of job vacancies</u> was for <u>professionals</u> - major group 2 (1.42%, respectively 13.7 thousand job vacancies), respectively for elementary occupations - major group 9 (1.22%, respectively 7.6 thousand job vacancies) and the **lowest** demand for <u>skilled</u> <u>agricultural</u>, <u>forestry</u> and <u>fishery workers</u> - major group 6 (0.43 percentage points, respectively 0.1 thousand job vacancies).

Quarter II 2015 compared to previous periods

As against the **previous quarter**, the **most relevant increases** for both <u>the rate</u> and <u>the number of job vacancies</u> was registered for <u>elementary occupations</u> - major group 9 (+0.11 percentage points, respectively +1.0 thousand job vacancies), and at the opposite side with the most significant **decreases** the occupation related to <u>clerical support workers</u> - major group 4 (-0.16 percentage points, respectively -0.4 thousand job vacancies) were found.

As against the **same quarter of the previous year** the most significant **increase** of <u>the job vacancies</u> <u>rate</u> was registered for <u>elementary occupations</u> - major group 9 (+0.34 percentage points), and as concernig <u>the number of job vacancies</u> for <u>professionals</u> - major group 2 (+2.7 percentage points).

The only decrease for both <u>the rate</u> and <u>the</u> <u>number of job vacancies</u> were for <u>skilled</u> agricultural, forestry and fishery workers - major group 6 (-0.16 percentage points, respectively -0.01 thousand job vacancies).
