

Domain: International trade with goods

International trade with goods in March and the period 1.I-31.III 2020

- In the period 1.I-31.III 2020, the FOB exports amounted to 17071.4 million euro and the CIF imports amounted to 21526.5 million euro.
- In the period 1.I-31.III 2020, the exports decreased by 2.6% and imports increased by 1.3%, compared to the period 1.I-31.III 2019.
- In the period 1.I-31.III 2020, the FOB-CIF commercial deficit was of 4455.1 million euro, 732.4 million euro more than in the period 1.I-31.III 2019.
- In March 2020, the FOB exports amounted to 5439.9 million euro and the CIF imports amounted to 7295.0 million euro, a commercial deficit of 1855.1 million euro being registered.
- Compared to March 2019, the exports decreased by 11.3% and the imports decreased by 1.8% in March 2020.

In the period 1.I-31.III 2020, important shares in the structure of exports and imports are represented by the following groups of goods: machinery and transport equipment (48.3% for export and 36.2% for import) and other manufactured goods¹⁾ (30.1% for export and 29.3% for import, respectively).

Note: The differences between total and data obtained by cumulating the different structures used are due to the roundings performed.

In the period 1.I-31.III 2020, the Intra-EU27 trade of goods amounted to 12343.9 million euro for dispatches and to 15827.9 million euro for arrivals, representing 72.3% of total exports and 73.5% of total imports.


In the period 1.I-31.III 2020, the Extra-EU27 trade of goods amounted to 4727.5 million euro for exports and to 5698.6 million euro for imports, representing 27.7% of total exports and 26.5% of total imports.

¹⁾ Manufactured goods mainly grouped by the raw material (iron, steel, rubber, metal, etc.) and miscellaneous manufactured articles (clothes and accessories, footwear, etc.)

Additional information:

FOB/CIF trade balance is calculated on the basis of the FOB export value and CIF import value as difference between them. The negative balance of the trade balance is called deficit and the positive one is called excedent.

FOB price (Free on Board) represents **the price at the border of the exporting country**, which includes the value of the commodity, all transport expenditures to the shipping point as well as all the fees for the commodity to be loaded on board.

CIF price (Cost, Insurance, Freight) represents **the price** at **the border of the importing country**, including both components of FOB price and the cost of insurance as well as the cost of the international transport.
