





# In May 2017, the retail turnover increased by 14.0% compared to May 2016

- Compared to the previous month, in May 2017 the retail turnover volume (excluding the trade with motor vehicles and motorcycles) increased both as gross series by 4.0% and as adjusted series according to the number of working days and to seasonality by 4.4%.
- Compared to the corresponding month of the previous year, the retail turnover volume (excluding the trade with motor vehicles and motorcycles) increased both as gross series and as adjusted series according to the number of working days and to seasonality by 14.0% and by 12.3%, respectively.
- Compared to the period 1.I-31.V.2016, in the period 1.I-31.V.2017 the retail turnover volume (excluding the trade with motor vehicles and motorcycles) increased both as gross series and as adjusted series according to the number of working days and to seasonality by 7.9% and by 8.2%, respectively.

#### May 2017 as against April 2017

As against the previous month, in May 2017 the retail turnover volume (excluding the trade with motor vehicles and motorcycles), gross series, globally increased by 4.0% due to increments registered by the retail of automotive fuel in specialised stores (+10.2%), by the sale of non-food products (+4.1%) and by the sale of food, beverages and tobacco (+0.2%).

As against the previous month, in May 2017 the retail turnover volume (excluding the trade with motor vehicles and motorcycles), adjusted series according to the number of working days and to seasonality, globally increased by 4.4% due to the increments registered by the sale of food, beverages and tobacco (+3.6%), by the retail of automotive fuel in specialised stores (+2.2%) and by the sale of non-food products (+1.8%).

# May 2017 as against May 2016

As against May 2016, in May 2017, the retail turnover volume (excluding the trade with motor vehicles and motorcycles), gross series, registered an increase of 14.0% due to the increments registered by the sale of non-food products (+15.4%), by the sale of food, beverages and tobacco (+13.3%) and by the retail of automotive fuel in specialised stores (+12.7%).

As against May 2016, in May 2017, the retail turnover volume (excluding the trade with motor vehicles and motorcycles), adjusted series according to the number of working days and to seasonality, registered an increase of 12.3% due to the increments registered by the sale of non-food products (+15.3%), by the retail of automotive fuel in specialised stores (+12.2%) and by the sale of food, beverages and tobacco (+6.2%).

## Period 1.I-31.V.2017 as against period 1.I-31.V.2016

As against the period 1.I-31.V.2016, in the period 1.I-31.V.2017 the retail turnover volume (excluding the trade with motor vehicles and motorcycles), gross series, registered an increase of 7.9% due to the increments registered by the retail of automotive fuel in specialised stores (+11.1%), by the sale of non-food products (+10.2%) and by the sale of food, beverages and tobacco (+3.6%).

As against the period 1.I-31.V.2016, in the period 1.I-31.V.2017 the retail turnover volume (excluding the trade with motor vehicles and motorcycles), adjusted series according to the number of working days and to seasonality, registered an increase of 8.2% due to the increments registered by the sale of non-food products (+11.2%), by the retail of automotive fuel in specialised stores (+10.1%) and by the sale of food, beverages and tobacco (+3.4%).

## Additional information:

- ✓ The turnover represents the total revenue recorded by the company during the reporting period, obtained from both the main activity and the secondary activities performed by them. The turnover does not include VAT and the revenue from the sale or transfer of assets.
- ✓ The turnover volume indices of the retail are Laspeyres type indices and are calculated under comparable prices and methodological conditions. For expressing the values of the current period in prices of the reference period, the deflating price indices are used (consumer price index). The first indices obtained are at the level of class/group CANE Rev. 2, then, by successive aggregations, indices at aggregated levels are obtained. The weights used for aggregation are calculated based on the turnover according to the results of the Business Structural Survey from the reference year (2010).
