# Livestock existent on December 1, 2019

- The pig, sheep and goats and poultry livestock increased in 2019 compared to 2018. Instead, the cattle livestock decreased.
- In 2019, Romania ranked third in the hierarchy of the European Union member states for the sheep and goats livestock.

Animal and poultry livestock existent on December 1, 2019 compared to December 1, 2018

The total number of cattle decreased on December 1, 2019 by 2.7% compared to December 1, 2018. Likewise, the origin livestock (milk cows, buffalo cows for reproduction and heifers for reproduction) decreased by 3.0%.

The total number of pigs increased by 0.8% and the origin livestock (sows for breeding) decreased by 0.9%.

Increases are also registered both for **the total number of sheep and goats** with 1.8% and for the origin livestock (sheep, ewes and goats) with 0.5%.

The total number of adult poultry increased by 2.0% and the number of laying poultry by 10.1%.

# The livestock evolution in the period 2006 - 2019


The cattle livestock permanently decreased from 2006 until 2011, reaching 1988.9 thousand heads. From 2011 to 2019, the cattle livestock maintained an approximately constant level, representing 65.6% in 2019 compared to 2006.

Also, the pig livestock constantly decreased, reaching to 58.1% in 2019 compared to 2006.

In the analysed period, the sheep and goats livestock began to increase, reaching 11923.1 thousand heads in 2019, 41.8% more than in 2006.
