Livestock existent on December 1, 2020

- Sheep and goats livestock increased in 2020 compared to last year. Instead, the pig, cattle and poultry livestock decreased.
- In 2020, Romania ranked second in the hierarchy of the European Union member states for the sheep and goats livestock.

The total number of cattle decreased on December 1, 2020 by 0.6% compared to December 1, 2019 and the the origin livestock (milk cows, buffalo cows for reproduction and heifers for reproduction) increased by 0.7%.

The total number of pigs and the origin livestock (sows for breeding) decreased by 2.2% and respectively by 0.1%.

Increases are also registered both for **the total number of sheep and goats** with 1.2% and for the origin livestock (sheep, ewes and goats) with 0.6%.

The total number of adult poultry decreased by 6.5% and the number of laying poultry by 10.5%.

The livestock evolution in the period 2006 - 2020


The cattle livestock permanently decreased from 2006 until 2011, reaching 1988.9 thousand heads. From 2011 to 2020, the cattle livestock maintained an approximately constant level, representing 65.1% in 2020 compared to 2006.

The pig livestock constantly decreased, reaching to 55.0% in 2020 compared to 2006.

In the analysed period, the sheep and goats livestock began to increase, reaching 12094.8 thousand heads in 2020, 43.9% more than in 2006.
