# Livestock existent on December 1, 2021

- In 2021, the cattle, pig and sheep and goats livestock decreased compared to 2020.
- Romania ranked third in the hierarchy of the European Union member states for the sheep and goats livestock.

The total number of cattle and the origin livestock (milk cows, buffalo cows for reproduction and heifers for reproduction) decreased on December 1 2021 compared to December 1 2020, by 3.0% and by 2.8%, respectively.

The total number of pigs and the origin livestock (sows for breeding) decreased by 4.4% and by 5.4%, respectively

Both **the total number of sheep and goats** and the origin livestock (sheep, ewes and goats) decreased by 3.0% and by 1.5%, respectively.

The total number of poultry and the number of adult laying poultry increased by 8.1% and by 14.9%, respectively.

## The animal livestock evolution in the period 2006 – 2021


In the analysed period the cattle livestock continuously decreased from 2006 until 2011, reaching 1988.9 thousand heads. From 2011 to 2021, the cattle livestock maintained an approximately constant level, representing 62.0% in 2021 compared to 2006.

The pig livestock decreased, reaching to 53.1% in 2021 compared to 2006.

The sheep and goats livestock have been increasing, reaching 11536.0 thousand heads in 2021, respectively 37.2% more than in 2006.
