



IN JANUARY 2016, THE CONSTRUCTION WORKS INCREASED BY 6.7% COMPARED TO JANUARY 2015

- Compared to the corresponding month of the previous year, the volume of construction works increased, as gross series, by 6.7% and as adjusted series by the number of working days and by seasonality increased by 8.8%


**Monthly evolution of construction works, by structure elements,

January 2016 compared to December 2015

The volume of construction works decreased, as gross series, by 73.5%, decrease highlighted as follows: in capital repairs works by 82.9%, in new construction works by 72.3% and in maintenance and current repairs works by 69.2%.

By construction objects there were drops as follows: in engineering works of 82.0%, in non-residential buildings of 61.1% and in residential buildings of 40.6%.

The volume of construction works decreased, as adjusted series by the number of working days and by seasonality, by 6.4%, decrease highlighted as follows: in capital repairs works of 32.0% and in new construction works of 11.7%. There was an increase of 0.6% in maintenance and current repairs works. By construction objects there were rises in residential buildings and in non-residential buildings of 47.3% and of 13.5%, respectively. There was a decrease of 18.8% in engineering works.

January 2016 compared to January 2015

The volume of construction works increased, as gross series, by 6.7%. By structure elements there were rises in the maintenance and current repairs works of 28.7% and in the new construction works of 11.5%. There was a decrease of 1.2% in capital repairs works.

By construction objects there were rises as follows: in residential buildings of 11.4%, in non-residential buildings of 8.2% and in the engineering works of 3.9%.

The volume of construction works increased, as adjusted series by the number of working days and by seasonality, by 8.8%. By structure elements, there were rises as follows: in maintenance and current repairs works of 19.1%, in capital repairs works of 11.1% and in new construction works of 2.2%.

By construction objects, the volume of construction works increased as follows: residential buildings by 18.7%, engineering works by 15.8% and non-residential buildings by 5.5%.
