The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in February 2017 down 0.7% from February 2016

- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in February 2017 decreased by 2.4% compared to January 2017 and was down 0.7% from February 2016.
- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in the 1.I-28.II.2017 period increased by 0.3% compared to the 1.I-29.II.2016 period.

February 2017 compared to January 2017

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in February 2017 fell by 1738 tonnes (-2.4%) compared to the previous month.

Decreases in production were recorded for drinking milk, with 2736 less tonnes produced (-10.4%) in February 2017 than in January 2017, acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), for which a 655 tonne drop (-3.7%) was reported, cream, with 75 less tonnes produced (-1.4%), and butter, for which a 12 tonne drop (-1.2%) was reported.

The production of cheese products was up 485 tonnes (+7.8%) in February 2017 from the previous month.

The quantity of imported raw milk fell by 1292 tonnes (-8.9%) in February 2017 compared to January 2017.

February 2017 compared to February 2016

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in February 2017 was down 505 tonnes (-0.7%) from the same month of the previous year.

Decreases in production were recorded for cream, with 654 less tonnes produced (-11.1%) in February 2017 than in February 2016, drinking milk, for which a 322 tonne drop (-1.3%) was reported, and cheese products, with 30 less tonnes produced (-0.4%).

Increases in production were recorded for butter, for which a 90 tonne rise (+9.6%) was reported, and acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), with 138 more tonnes produced (+0.8%).

The quantity of imported raw milk rose by 163 tonnes (+1.2%) in February 2017 compared to the same month of the previous year.

The 1.I-28.II.2017 period compared to the 1.I-29.II.2016 period


The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in the 1.I-28.II.2017 period rose by 407 tonnes (+0.3%) compared to the 1.I-29.II.2016 period.

Increases in production were recorded for butter, for which a 328 tonne rise (+18.8%) was reported in the 1.I-28.II.2017 period compared to the same period of the previous year, drinking milk, with 3021 more tonnes produced (+6.4%), acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), for which a 717 tonne rise (+2.1%) was reported, and cheese products, with 145 more tonnes produced (+1.1%).

The production of cream was down 1425 tonnes (-11.9%).

The quantity of imported raw milk increased by 2484 tonnes (+9.8%) in the 1.I-28.II.2017 period compared to the 1.I-29.II.2016 period.
