The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in March 2017 up 5.9% from March 2016

- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in March 2017 increased by 19.9% compared to February 2017 and was up 5.9% from March 2016.
- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in Quarter I 2017 rose by 2.3% compared to Quarter I 2016.

March 2017 compared to February 2017

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in March 2017 rose by 14126 tonnes (+19.9%) compared to the previous month.

Increases in production were recorded for butter, with 122 more tonnes produced (+11.9%) in March 2017 than in February 2017, drinking milk, for which a 2761 tonne rise (+11.7%) was reported, cheese products, with 749 more tonnes produced (+11.1%), acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), with 158 more tonnes produced (+0.9%), and cream, for which a 19 tonne rise (+0.4%) was reported.

The quantity of imported raw milk increased by 1849 tonnes (+13.9%) in March 2017 compared to February 2017.

March 2017 compared to March 2016

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in March 2017 was up 4716 tonnes (+5.9%) from the same month of the previous year.

Increases in production were recorded for butter, with 179 more tonnes produced (+18.4%) in March 2017 than in March 2016, acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), for which a 296 tonne rise (+1.8%) was reported, and drinking milk, with 269 more tonnes produced (+1.0%).

Decreases in production were recorded for cream, for which a 407 tonne drop (-7.2%) was reported, and cheese products, with 470 less tonnes produced (-5.9%).

The quantity of imported raw milk rose by 2404 tonnes (+18.9%) in March 2017 compared to the same month of the previous year.

Quarter I 2017 compared to Quarter I 2016


The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in Quarter I 2017 rose by 5123 tonnes (+2.3%) compared to Quarter I 2016.

Increases in production were recorded for butter, for which a 507 tonne rise (+18.7%) was reported in Quarter I 2017 compared to Quarter I 2016, drinking milk, with 3291 more tonnes produced (+4.5%), and acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), with 1011 more tonnes produced (+2.0%).

Decreases in production were recorded for cream, with 1832 less tonnes produced (-10.3%), and cheese products, for which a 325 tonne drop (-1.6%) was reported.

The quantity of imported raw milk was up 4887 tonnes (+12.8%) in Quarter I 2017 from Quarter I 2016.
