The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in March 2019

- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in March 2019 increased by 19.4% compared to February 2019 and was up 9.9% from March 2018.
- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in the 1.I-31.III.2019 period rose by 7.7% compared to the 1.I-31.III.2018 period.

March 2019 compared to February 2019

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in March 2019 rose by 15986 tonnes (+19.4%) compared to the previous month.

Increases in production were recorded for the following milk products in March 2019 compared to February 2019: cheese products, for which a 937 tonne rise (+13.4%) was reported, drinking milk, with 1019 more tonnes produced (+3.6%), and butter, for which a 24 tonne rise (+2.8%) was reported.

The production of cream decreased by 324 tonnes (-5.9%) and the production of acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products) fell by 193 tonnes (-1.0%).

The quantity of imported raw milk increased by 33 tonnes (+0.3%) in March 2019 compared to the previous month.

March 2019 compared to March 2018

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in March 2019 was up 8820 tonnes (+9.9%) from the same month of the previous year.

Increases in production were recorded for drinking milk, for which a 3655 tonne rise (+14.2%) was reported, acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), with 1407 more tonnes produced (+8.3%), and cheese products, for which a 280 tonne rise (+3.7%) was reported.

The production of butter fell by 226 tonnes (-20.5%) and the production of cream decreased by 522 tonnes (-9.2%).

The quantity of imported raw milk was down 2451 tonnes (-19.7%) in March 2019 from the same month of the previous year.

The 1.I-31.III.2019 period compared to the 1.I-31.III.2018 period


The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in the 1.I-31.III.2019 period rose by 19054 tonnes (+7.7%) compared to the 1.I-31.III.2018 period.

Increases in production were recorded for drinking milk, with 7192 more tonnes produced (+9.3%) in the 1.I-31.III.2019 period than in the 1.I-31.III.2018 period, acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), for which a 2835 tonne rise (+5.2%) was reported, and cheese products, with 431 more tonnes produced (+2.0%).

The production of butter decreased by 70 tonnes (-2.5%) and the production of cream fell by 33 tonnes (-0.2%).

The quantity of imported raw milk was down 12525 tonnes (-29.3%) in the 1.I-31.III.2019 period from the 1.I-31.III.2018 period.
