The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in May 2019

- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in May 2019 increased by 13.0% compared to April 2019 and was up 0.3% from May 2018.
- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in the 1.I-31.V.2019 period rose by 5.3% compared to the 1.I-31.V.2018 period.

May 2019 compared to April 2019

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in May 2019 rose by 12853 tonnes (+13.0%) compared to the previous month.

Increases in production were recorded for the following milk products in May 2019 compared to April 2019: acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), for which a 3444 tonne rise (+19.8%) was reported, cheese products, with 1424 more tonnes produced (+16.8%), cream, with 160 more tonnes produced (+2.8%), and drinking milk, for which a 304 tonne rise (+1.1%) was reported.

The production of butter fell by 232 tonnes (-22.8%).

^{*)} It includes yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products.

^{**)} Due to rounding, the data related to the cumulated periods may differ from the ones resulting from summing up the months.

The quantity of raw milk imported by processing units decreased by 831 tonnes (-11.0%) in May 2019 compared to the previous month.

May 2019 compared to May 2018

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in May 2019 was up 337 tonnes (+0.3%) from the same month of the previous year.

Increases in production were recorded for acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), with 2078 more tonnes produced (+11.1%), cream, for which a 290 tonne rise (+5.1%) was reported, and drinking milk, with 1104 more tonnes produced (+4.2%).

Decreases in production were recorded for butter, with 107 less tonnes produced (-12.0%), and cheese products, for which a 262 tonne fall (-2.6%) was reported.

The quantity of raw milk imported by processing units was down 3147 tonnes (-31.9%) in May 2019 from the same month of the previous year.

The 1.I-31.V.2019 period compared to the 1.I-31.V.2018 period

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in the 1.I-31.V.2019 period rose by 24135 tonnes (+5.3%) compared to the 1.I-31.V.2018 period.

Increases in production in the 1.I-31.V.2019 period compared to the same period of the previous year were recorded for: drinking milk, with 10070 more tonnes produced (+7.8%), acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), for which a 6935 tonne rise (+7.8%) was reported, cream, with 1108 more tonnes produced (+4.1%), butter, for which a 62 tonne rise (+1.4%) was reported, and cheese products, with 496 more tonnes produced (+1.2%).

The quantity of raw milk imported by processing units was down 18357 tonnes (-29.2%) in the 1.I-31.V.2019 period from the 1.I-31.V.2018 period.
