- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in the 1.I-31.VIII.2017 period rose by 6.2% compared to the 1.I-31.VIII.2016 period.

August 2017 compared to July 2017

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in August 2017 fell by 7444 tonnes (-7.7%) compared to the previous month.

Decreases in production were recorded for cheese products, with 739 less tonnes produced (-8.6%) in August 2017 than in July 2017, and cream, for which a 121 tonne fall (-2.2%) was reported.

The main milk products for which production increased were drinking milk, with 2814 more tonnes produced (+14.8%), butter, for which a 69 tonne rise (+8.1%) was reported, and acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), with 292 more tonnes produced (+1.6%).

The quantity of imported raw milk increased by 3138 tonnes (+56.1%) in August 2017 compared to July 2017.

August 2017 compared to August 2016

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in August 2017 was up 6347 tonnes (+7.6%) from the same month of the previous year.

Increases in production were recorded for cheese products, with 722 more tonnes produced (+10.2%), acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), for which a 1557 tonne rise (+9.2%) was reported, drinking milk, with 1586 more tonnes produced (+7.8%), and butter, for which a 34 tonne rise (+3.8%) was reported.

A decrease in production was recorded for cream, with 538 less tonnes produced (-9.1%).

The quantity of imported raw milk rose by 1451 tonnes (+19.9%) in August 2017 compared to the same month of the previous year.

The 1.I-31.VIII.2017 period compared to the 1.I-31.VIII.2016 period


The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in the 1.I-31.VIII.2017 period rose by 40996 tonnes (+6.2%) compared to the 1.I-31.VIII.2016 period.

Increases in production were recorded for butter, for which a 735 tonne rise (+10.2%) was reported, acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), with 7375 more tonnes produced (+5.5%), drinking milk, for which a 6405 tonne rise (+3.6%) was reported, and cheese products, with 814 more tonnes produced (+1.3%).

A decrease in production was recorded for cream, with 3119 less tonnes produced (-6.8%).

The quantity of imported raw milk was up 5190 tonnes (+6.8%) in the same period.
