The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in October 2018

- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in October 2018 increased by 1.2% compared to September 2018 and was up 7.9% from October 2017.
- The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units from agricultural holdings and collection centres in the 1.I-31.X.2018 period rose by 7.8% compared to the 1.I-31.X.2017 period.

October 2018 compared to September 2018

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in October 2018 rose by 1041 tonnes (+1.2%) compared to the previous month.

Increases in production were recorded for cream, with 573 more tonnes produced (+10.5%) in October 2018 than in September 2018, acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), with 1519 more tonnes produced (+8.6%), butter, for which a 70 tonne rise (+7.9%) was reported, drinking milk, with 1158 more tonnes produced (+4.5%), and cheese products, with 170 more tonnes produced (+2.3%).

The quantity of imported raw milk decreased by 649 tonnes (-6.5%) in October 2018 compared to the previous month.

October 2018 compared to October 2017

The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in October 2018 was up 6597 tonnes (+7.9%) from the same month of the previous year.

Increases in production were recorded for cheese products, for which a 379 tonne rise (+5.4%) was reported, acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), with 927 more tonnes produced (+5.1%), and drinking milk, for which a 550 tonne rise (+2.1%) was reported.

Decreases in production were recorded for butter, with 81 less tonnes produced (-7.8%), and cream, with 125 less tonnes produced (-2.0%).

The quantity of imported raw milk decreased by 2643 tonnes (-22.1%) in October 2018 compared to the same month of the previous year.

The 1.I-31.X.2018 period compared to the 1.I-31.X.2017 period


The quantity of cow's milk collected by processing units in the 1.I-31.X.2018 period rose by 68126 tonnes (+7.8%) compared to the 1.I-31.X.2017 period.

Increases in production were recorded for drinking milk, with 17719 more tonnes produced (+7.5%) in the 1.I-31.X.2018 period than in the same period of the previous year, cheese products, for which a 3166 tonne rise (+4.1%) was reported, acidified milk (yogurt, drinking yogurt, curd and other similar milk products), for which a 2740 tonne rise (+1.5%) was reported, and cream, with 563 more tonnes produced (+1.0%).

The production of butter decreased by 1153 tonnes (-11.7%).

The quantity of imported raw milk was up 1701 tonnes (+1.7%) in the 1.I-31.X.2018 period from the 1.I-31.X.2017 period.
