





MORE JOB VACANCIES IN THE FIRST QUARTER 2022

- In the first quarter 2022, the **number of job vacancies** was 47.3 thousand, increasing by 1.7 thousand as against the **previous quarter**.
- The job vacancies rate¹ estimated for the 1st quarter 2022 was 0.95%, increasing by 0.03 percentage points as against the **previous quarter**.
- By comparison with the same quarter 2021, the job vacancies rate increased by 0.16 percentage points and the number of job vacancies increased by 8.9 thousand.

The rate and the number of job vacancies by economic activities

In the first quarter 2022, the **highest** <u>job</u> <u>vacancies rates</u> were registered in the activities from the following domains: water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (1.73%), information and communication, public administration (1.72% each).

In *manufacturing* was concentrated a little bit less than one fourth of the <u>total number of job vacancies</u> (11.0 thousand job vacancies), having a <u>rate</u> value of 1.01%.

The budgetary sector² summed up almost 23% of the <u>total number of job vacancies</u>. Thus, 4.9 thousand job vacancies were found in *human health and social work activities*, 4.6 thousand job vacancies in *public administration*, and 1.2 thousand job vacancies in *education*.

¹ **Job vacancies rate** represents the ratio between number of job vacancies and total number of jobs (occupied and vacant, <u>except those blocked or meant only for promotion inside the enterprise or institution</u>), expressed in percentages.

At the opposite side, the <u>job vacancies rate</u> registered the **lowest** values in *mining and* quarrying (0.20%) and other service activities (0.28%).


The **fewest** <u>job vacancies</u> were found in <u>mining</u> and quarrying, real estate activities, respectively in other service activities (0.1 thousand job each).

Quarter I 2022 compared to previous periods

As against the **previous quarter**, the <u>job</u> <u>vacancies rate</u> registered the most relevant **increases** in water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (+0.49 percentage points), respectively financial and insurance activities (+0.47 percentage points).

As concerning the <u>number of job vacancies</u>, the most significant **increases** were in the activities from construction (+0.9 thousand job vacancies), wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles, respectively water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (+0.5 thousand job vacancies each).

The most significant **decreases**, for both the <u>rate</u> and the <u>number of job vacancies</u>, were found in the activities of <u>human health and social work activities</u> (-0.29 percentage points, respectively -0.9 thousand job vacancies) and <u>public administration</u> (-0.25 percentage points, respectively -0.9 thousand job vacancies).

As against the same quarter of the previous year, the most relevant increases of the <u>job</u> <u>vacancies rate</u> were in <u>financial</u> and insurance activities (+0.63 percentage points), information and communication (+0.53 percentage points), respectively in <u>electricity</u>, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (+0.52 percentage points).

As regarding the <u>number of job vacancies</u>, the most important **increases** were noticed in manufacturing (+2.8 thousand job vacancies), wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles (+2.4 thousand job vacancies), respectively information and communication (+1.4 thousand job vacancies).

At the opposite side, the most significant decreases, for both the <u>rate</u> and the <u>number of job vacancies</u>, were found in <u>public administration</u> (-0.28 percentage points, respectively -0.9 thousand job vacancies), respectively in <u>human health and social work activities</u> (-0.26 percentage points, respectively -0.7 thousand job vacancies).

The rate and the number of job vacancies by major groups of occupations


In the first quarter 2022, the **highest** values were registered for the occupations related to *professionals* – major group 2, for both the <u>rate</u> and the <u>number of job vacancies</u> (1.21%, respectively 13.7 thousand job vacancies).

The **lowest** values for both indicators were registered in occupations related to *skilled* agricultural, forestry and fishery workers – major group 6 (0.57%, respectively 0.1 thousand job vacancies) and to *managers* – major group 1 (0.45%, respectively 1.6 thousand job vacancies).

Quarter I 2022 compared to previous periods

As against **the previous quarter**, the most relevant **increases**, for both the <u>rate</u> and the <u>number of job vacancies</u>, were for the occupations related to <u>craft and related trades</u> workers — major group 7 (+0.16 percentage points, respectively +1.1 thousand job vacancies) and to <u>plant and machine operators and assemblers</u> — major group 8 (+0.14 percentage points, respectively +0.7 thousand job vacancies).

At the opposite side, both indicators registered higher **decreases** for occupations related to service and sales workers — major group 5 (-0.03 percentage points, respectively -0.3 thousand job vacancies), managers — major group 1 (-0.07 percentage points, respectively -0.2 thousand job vacancies), respectively clerical support workers — major group 4 (-0.02 percentage points, respectively -0.2 thousand job vacancies).

As against the **same quarter of the previous year**, with the exception of occupations related to *managers* – major group 1 (-0.02 percentage

points, respectively -0.03 thousand job vacancies), the two analysed indicators registered **increases** for all major groups of occupations, the most relevant one being for occupations related to *professionals* – major group 2 (+0.25 percentage points, respectively +3.0 thousand job vacancies).

Also, for both the <u>rate</u> and the <u>number of job</u> <u>vacancies</u>, important **increases** were also noticed for the occupations related to <u>service</u> and <u>sales</u> workers — major group 5 (+0.20 percentage points, respectively +1.7 thousand job vacancies) and for those related to <u>plant</u> and <u>machine</u> operators and <u>assemblers</u> — major group 8 (+0.23 percentage points, respectively +1.2 thousand job vacancies).
