

### **LESS JOB VACANCIES IN THE SECOND QUARTER 2022**

- In the second quarter 2022, the **number of job vacancies** was 46.0 thousand, decreasing by 1.3 thousand as against the **previous quarter**.
- The job vacancies rate¹ estimated for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2022 was 0.91%, decreasing by 0.04 percentage points as against the **previous quarter**.
- By comparison with the same quarter 2021, the job vacancies rate increased by 0.11 percentage points and the number of job vacancies increased by 6.5 thousand.

# The rate and the number of job vacancies by economic activities

In the second quarter 2022, the **highest** <u>job</u> <u>vacancies rates</u> were registered in <u>public</u> administration (1.84%), water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (1.63%) and arts, entertainment and recreation (1.60%).

In *manufacturing* was concentrated almost one fourth of the <u>total number of job vacancies</u> (11.4 thousand job vacancies), having a <u>rate</u> value of 1.04%.

The budgetary sector<sup>2</sup> summed up about 25% of the <u>total number of job vacancies</u>.

Thus, 5.3 thousand job vacancies were found in human health and social work activities, 5.0 thousand job vacancies in public administration, and 1.2 thousand job vacancies in education.

At the opposite side, the <u>job vacancies rate</u> registered the **lowest** values in *other service*

activities (0.24%) and in mining and quarrying (0.30%).


The **fewest** <u>job vacancies</u> were found in *real* estate activities, other service activities, respectively in mining and quarrying (0.1 thousand job each).

#### Quarter II 2022 compared to previous periods

As against the **previous quarter**, the <u>job</u> <u>vacancies rate</u> registered the most relevant **increases** in <u>public</u> administration (+0.12 percentage points), human health and social work activities (+0.11 percentage points), respectively in <u>mining</u> and quarrying (+0.10 percentage points).

As concerning the <u>number of job vacancies</u>, this knew the most important **increases** in *human health and social work activities* and in *manufacturing* (+0.4 thousand job vacancies each), followed by *public administration* (+0.3 thousand job vacancies).

The most significant **decreases**, for both the <u>rate</u> and the <u>number of job vacancies</u>, were found in <u>financial</u> and insurance activities (-0.35 percentage points, respectively -0.3 thousand job vacancies) and in <u>information</u> and <u>communication</u> (-0.28 percentage points, respectively -0.5 thousand job vacancies).

As against the same quarter of the previous year, almost all economic activities knew increases for both indicators. Thus, the most relevant increases of the <u>job vacancies rate</u> were in water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (+0.40 percentage points) and in *financial and insurance activities* (+0.36 percentage points).

As regarding the <u>number of job vacancies</u>, the most important **increase** was noticed in *manufacturing* (+3.4 thousand job vacancies).

At the opposite side, the only decreases, for both the rate and the number of job vacancies, found public were in administration (-0.21)percentage points, respectively -0.7 thousand job vacancies), human health and social work activities (-0.19 percentage points, -0.5 thousand job vacancies), respectively respectively in arts, entertainment recreation (-0.15 percentage points, respectively -0.02 thousand job vacancies).

## The rate and the number of job vacancies by major groups of occupations

In the second quarter 2022, the **highest** values were registered for the occupations related to *professionals* – major group 2, for both the *rate* and the *number of job vacancies* (1.23%, respectively 13.9 thousand job vacancies).

The **lowest** values for both indicators were registered in occupations related to *managers* – major group 1 (0.48%, respectively 1.8 thousand job vacancies) and to *skilled agricultural*, *forestry and fishery workers* – major group 6 (0.50%, respectively 0.1 thousand job vacancies).


### Quarter II 2022 compared to previous periods

As against **the previous quarter**, the only **increases** of the <u>job vacancies rate</u> were found for occupations related to <u>managers</u> – major group 1 (+0.03 percentage points), respectively <u>professionals</u> – major group 2 (+0.02 percentage points).

As concerning the <u>number of job vacancies</u>, the highest **increases** were for the occupations related to <u>professionals</u> — major group 2 (+0.3 thousand job vacancies), respectively <u>managers</u> — major group 1 and <u>plant and machine operators and assemblers</u> — major group 8 (+0.1 thousand job vacancies each).

At the opposite side, the <u>job vacancies rate</u> registered higher **decreases** in occupations related to *service and sales workers* – major group 5 (-0.15 percentage points), *skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers* – major

group 6, respectively *elementary occupations* – major group 9 (-0.07 percentage points each).

The <u>number of job vacancies</u> knew more relevant **decreases** in occupations related to *service and sales workers* – major group 5 (-1.1 thousand job vacancies), followed by *elementary occupations* – major group 9 (-0.4 thousand job vacancies), and in those of *craft and related trades workers* – major group 7 (-0.3 thousand job vacancies).

As against the same quarter of the previous year, with the exception of occupations related to service and sales workers — major group 5 (-0.03 percentage points, respectively -0.02 thousand job vacancies), the two indicators registered increases for all major groups of occupations.

Thus, for both the <u>rate</u> and the <u>number of job</u> <u>vacancies</u> the most relevant **increases** were noticed for occupations related to plant and machine operators and assemblers — major group 8 (+0.26 percentage points, respectively +1.4 thousand job vacancies), professionals — major group 2 (+0.20 percentage points, respectively +2.5 thousand job vacancies), respectively for elementary occupations — major group 9 (+0.14 percentage points, respectively +1.1 thousand job vacancies).
