Domain: Quarterly Gross domestic product - "flash" estimates

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT IN Q2 2025 WAS, IN REAL TERMS, BY 1.2%¹ HIGHER AS COMPARED TO Q1 2025

- Gross Domestic Product recorded, as against the same quarter of 2024, an increase by 0.3% for unadjusted series and by 2.1% for seasonally adjusted series;
- In the first semester of 2025, as against the same period of the previous year, the Gross Domestic Product increased by 0.3 % for the unadjusted series and by 1.4% for the seasonally adjusted series;
- The seasonally adjusted series of quarterly Gross Domestic Product was readjusted as a result of the introduction of the estimates for Q2 2025, being revised as compared to the version published in the Press release no. 175 of 10 July 2025.

The evolution of the quarterly Gross Domestic Product for the period 2023 – 2025, unadjusted and seasonally adjusted series, is presented in the table bellow.



Seasonally adjusted series

In Q2 2025, as compared to the previous quarter, the Gross Domestic Product increased by 1.2%.

As compared to the same quarter of 2024, the Gross Domestic Product increased by 2.1%.

In the first half of the year 2025, the Gross Domestic Product increased by 1.4% as compared to the same period of 2024.

Unadjusted series

As compared to the same quarter of 2024, Gross Domestic Product in Q2 2025 increased by 0.3%.

In the first half of the year 2025 the Gross Domestic Product increased by 0.3% as compared to the same period of 2024.

Revisions

As a result of the revision of the unadjusted series by including the estimates for Q2 2025 in the quarterly series, the seasonally adjusted series were re-estimated. The volume indices were revised as compared to the second provisional version of quarterly gross domestic product published in the Press release no. 175 of July 10, 2025 as follows:

- the results of first quarter of 2024, compared with the fourth quarter of 2023, were revised from 99.8% to 99.9%;
- the results of second quarter of 2024, compared with the first quarter of 2024, were revised from 100.3% to 99.8%;
- the results of third quarter of 2024, compared with the second quarter of 2024, were revised from 99.8% to 100.3%;

- the results of fourth quarter of 2024, compared with the third quarter of 2024, were revised from 100.5% to 100.4%;
- the results of the first quarter of 2025, compared with the fourth quarter of 2024, were revised from 100.0% to 100.1%;

The seasonally adjusted series are quarterly re-estimated according to the European practice.
