Animal production in 2020

- The weight of the animals to be slaughtered for consumption decreased in 2020 compared to 2019 for all animal species and poultry.
- The milk production increased and the wool and egg productions decreased in 2020 compared to 2019.

In 2020, compared to 2019, the following facts were recorded:

- the weight of the animals and poultry to be slaughtered for consumption decreased by 4.7% for sheep and goats, by 4.2% for poultry, by 4.1% for pigs and by 3.4% for cattle;
- the total milk production was by 1.2% higher;
- the wool production decreased by 3.2%;
- the egg production decreased by 2.4%%.

In 2020 compared to 2019, there were no significant changes in the structure of meat production.




Chart 2: Cow milk production in 2020, by development regions

In 2020, the cow milk production (including calves' consumption) was of 40049 thousand hectolitres, with 463 thousand hectolitres (+1.2%) more than in the previous year. Increases were registered in the following development regions: Bucharest-Ilfov (+5.9%), Centre (+5.5%), North-West (+3.5%), North-East (+2.3%) and West (+1.6%). Decreases were registered in South-East (-5.4%), South West-Oltenia (-3.7%), and South Muntenia (-2.6%).
