Animal production in 2022 - in agricultural holdings -

- The weight of the animals to be slaughtered for consumption increased in 2022 compared to 2021 for poultry and sheep and goats, while it decreased for pigs and cattle.
- In 2022, compared to the previous year, the production of wool and eggs increased and the production of milk decreased.

In 2022, compared to 2021, the following facts were recorded:

- the weight of the animals and poultry to be slaughtered for consumption increased by 8.6% for sheep and goats and by 5.7% for poultry and it decreased by 11.5% for pigs and by 1.2% for cattle;
- the total milk production was by 0.6% lower;
- the wool production increased by 3.1%;
- the egg production increased by 1.1%%.

Chart 1: Structure of total meat production (live weight)



Chart 2: Cow milk production in 2022, by development regions



In 2022, the cow milk production (including calves' consumption) was of 39009 thousand hectolitres, with 35 thousand hectolitres (-0.1%) less than in the previous year. Increases were registered in the following development regions: North-West (+5.4%), Centre (+3.9%), South Muntenia (+1.8%) and Bucharest-Ilfov (+0.9%) and decreases in the other development regions: South West-Oltenia (-7.4%), South-East (-6.8%), West (-4.1%) and North-East (-1.3%).

The development regions include the following counties:

- North-East development region: Bacau, Botosani, Iasi, Neamt, Suceava and Vaslui.
- South-East development region: Braila, Buzau, Constanta, Galati, Tulcea and Vrancea.
- **South-Muntenia** development region: Arges, Calarasi, Dambovita, Giurgiu, Ialomita, Prahova and Teleorman.
- South-West Oltenia development region: Dolj, Gorj, Mehedinti, Olt and Valcea.
- West development region: Arad, Caras-Severin, Hunedoara and Timis.
- North-West development region: Bihor, Bistrita-Nasaud, Cluj, Maramures, Satu-Mare and Salaj.
- Centre development region: Alba, Brasov, Covasna, Harghita, Mures and Sibiu.
- Bucharest-Ilfov development region: Bucharest municipality and Ilfov county.
