Animal production in 2023 - in agricultural holdings -

- The weight of the animals to be slaughtered for consumption increased in 2023 compared to 2022 for poultry, while it decreased for cattle, pigs and sheep and goats.
- In 2023, compared to the previous year, the production of milk and wool increased and the production of eggs decreased.

In 2023, compared to 2022, the following facts were recorded:

- the weight of the animals and poultry to be slaughtered for consumption increased by 3,4% for poultry and it decreased by 4,2% for cattle, by 3,7% for pigs and by 3,6% for sheep and goats;
- the total milk production was by 0,7% higher;
- the wool production increased by 5,9%;
- the egg production decreased by 2,3%.

Chart 1: Structure of total meat production (live weight)



Chart 2: Cow milk production in 2023, by development regions



In 2023, the cow milk production (including calves' consumption) was of 38803 thousand hectoliters, with 206 thousand hectoliters (-0,5%) less than in the previous year. Increases were registered in the following development regions: West (+12,4%) North-West (+9,0%), South-East (+0,7%) and decreases in the other development regions: Bucharest-Ilfov (-15,8%), Centre (-7,0%), North-East (-6,4%), South-West Oltenia (-3,0%) and South Muntenia (-1,3%).

- **South-Muntenia** development region: Arges, Calarasi, Dambovita, Giurgiu, Ialomita, Prahova and Teleorman.
- South-West Oltenia development region: Dolj, Gorj, Mehedinti, Olt and Valcea.
- West development region: Arad, Caras-Severin, Hunedoara and Timis.
- North-West development region: Bihor, Bistrita-Nasaud, Cluj, Maramures, Satu-Mare and Salaj.
- Centre development region: Alba, Brasov, Covasna, Harghita, Mures and Sibiu.
- Bucharest-Ilfov development region: Bucharest municipality and Ilfov county.
