# Animal production in 2024 - in agricultural holdings -

- The weight of the animals to be slaughtered for consumption increased in 2024 compared to 2023 for poultry, while it decreased for cattle, pigs and sheep and goats.
- In 2024, compared to the previous year, the production of milk increased and the production of wool and eggs decreased.

In 2024, compared to 2023, the following facts were recorded:

- the weight of the animals and poultry to be slaughtered for consumption increased by 9,4% for poultry and it decreased by 6,1% for cattle, by 0,5% for pigs and by 8,2% for sheep and goats;
- the total milk production was by 2,2% higher;
- the wool production decreased by 0,1%;
- the egg production decreased by 3,9%.

In 2024 compared to 2023, in the structure of meat production, the weight for poultry production registered an increase by 0.3 p.p, and the weights for cattle, pigs and sheep and goats decreased by 1.0 p.p.




Chart 2: Cow milk production in 2024, by development regions

In 2024, the cow milk production (including calves' consumption) was of 39723 thousand hectoliters, with 1157 thousand hectoliters (+3,0%) more than in the previous year. Increases were registered in the following development regions: Centre (+16.6%), West (+4,5%), North-West (+2,4%), South Muntenia (+2,3%) and decreases in the other development regions: South-East (-5,6%), South-West Oltenia (-3.2%), Bucharest-Ilfov (-3.1%) and North-East (-2.3%).

- North-East development region: Bacau, Botosani, Iasi, Neamt, Suceava and Vaslui.

- South-Muntenia development region: Arges, Calarasi, Dambovita, Giurgiu, Ialomita, Prahova and Teleorman.
- South-West Oltenia development region: Dolj, Gorj, Mehedinti, Olt and Valcea.
- West development region: Arad, Caras-Severin, Hunedoara and Timis.
- North-West development region: Bihor, Bistrita-Nasaud, Cluj, Maramures, Satu-Mare and Salaj.
- Centre development region: Alba, Brasov, Covasna, Harghita, Mures and Sibiu.
- Bucharest-Ilfov development region: Bucharest municipality and Ilfov county.
