Environmental protection expenditure in 2017

- In 2017, the environmental protection expenditure at national level amounted to RON 10.3 billion*, accounting for 1.2% of GDP**
- At national level, the highest environmental protection expenditure was recorded in waste sector, for the specialized producers, with a share of 76.6% in total waste related expenditure.
- At national level, the highest investments for environmental protection were recorded for waste water management by general government, with a share of 72.0% in total investments in waste water management.

At national level, the weight of general government investments was 50.0% of total investments for environmental protection, followed by the investments of unspecialized producers (38.5%) and by those of specialized producers (11.5%). 30.1% of the unspecialized producers' expenditure for environmental protection was in the field of "electric and thermal energy, gas and hot water production and supply", while 25.8% was for "manufacturing" and the expenditure for "water collection, treatment and supply" accounted for 19.3%.

^{*} The expenditure at national level include: current internal expenditure (current expenditure for own environmental protection activities) and other expenditure of general government (subsidies, transfers), while current external expenditure (mainly representing the expenditure for the purchase of environmental protection services from third parties)

By environmental fields, the highest expenditure was recorded for waste management (57.5% of total expenditure for environmental protection at national level), followed by the expenditure for waste water management (18.3%) and the expenditure for air protection (10.0%).
